Background

Following the tragic events of September 2001, it is now clear that there are numerous opportunities for improving our aviation security processes and reducing flight risks by using better processes enhanced with next-generation information technologies. In response to the White House's request that "every governmental agency should examine its capability to aid the nation in the fight against terrorism," the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) and the Ames Research Center (NASA's Center of Excellence for Information Technologies (including the Information Power Grid (IPG), the supercomputing capability (the single image Silicon Graphic computer with 1024 processors), advanced research in intelligent systems, and human-centered computing technology) have risen to the task, with the belief that the research and development of the IT systems existing at Ames might bring a possible solution to the information management and distribution for the entire national airspace system, as well as other modes of transportation.

NASA Ames has already established itself as the research center for several decision support tools for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in the air traffic management system. Therefore, utilization of advanced information technology capability will be a natural extension and become a potential tool to ensure a safer system for the nation's transportation systems.

NASA Ames' response to this challenge has been to create the Airline Passenger Identification and Threat Assessment (APITAS) in conjunction with Voquette, Inc. Phase One of the APITAS system was developed jointly by NASA Ames and Voquette, Inc. and deployed within the NASA Ames facilities from late 2001 to early 2002 (P.O. # A65489D). This Statement of Work describes the work to be delivered in Phase Two of the project.

APITAS Phase Two Tasks

While the initial Phase of the APITAS project showed the information management and link analysis capabilities of NASAAmes in a controlled, demonstration mode, Phase Two of the project will pursue additional developments towards the goal of an actual working system. This phase has the following primary tasks:

- 1) Transition the current Voquette implementation completely onto the NASA Ames computers and networks.
- 2) Enhance current real-time content and knowledge data streams with additional and improved content.
- 3) Improve the current organization of the data in the "World Model" and "Knowledgebase."
- 4) Assist in the integration of data from recently installed laboratory biometric sensors.
- 5) Integrate passenger information from LexisNexis.
- 6) Develop improvements to the front-end applications, with a primary focus on the interrogation kiosk.

The APITAS Phase Two implementation will extend the capabilities of the initial APITAS system in a number of ways:

- 1) Integration of LexisNexis personal information directly into the application.
- 2) Integration of front-end user interfaces with backend semantic engine (see <u>Appendix II</u>), and Biometric and other data inputs.
- 3) Improved GUI to better represent the underlying relationship modeling and link correlations.
- 4) Improved user interface for the knowledge browsing component, using graphical representations.
- 5) Improved Link Analysis and Relationship detection.
- 6) Expanded list of knowledge and content sources (see Appendix III for current sources used).
- 7) Wizards will be added to simplify common queries.


Because of the aggressive schedule for this Phase of the project and the constraint of personnel resources available within NASAAmes, Phase Two of the project will be staffed primarily by Voquette personnel. NASAAmes will retain project oversight, and be available for consultation, but Voquette, Inc will perform most development.

The period of performance will be July 31, 2002 through August 22, 2002, with the tasks completed in time for a planned demonstration for Representatives of the U.S. Congress on August 23, 2002. Upon successful completion of the listed tasks, and acceptance of the project work by the NASA requester, Voquette, Inc. may submit its invoice for payment.
